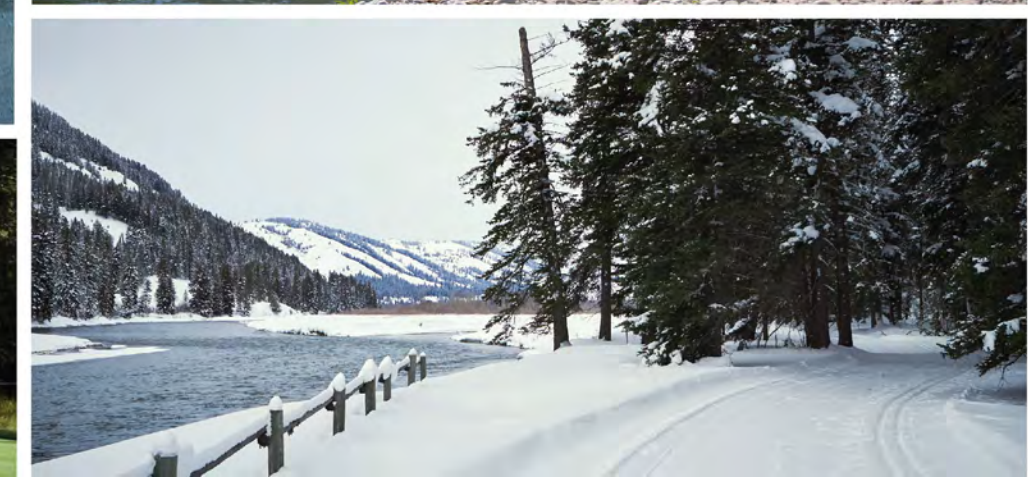
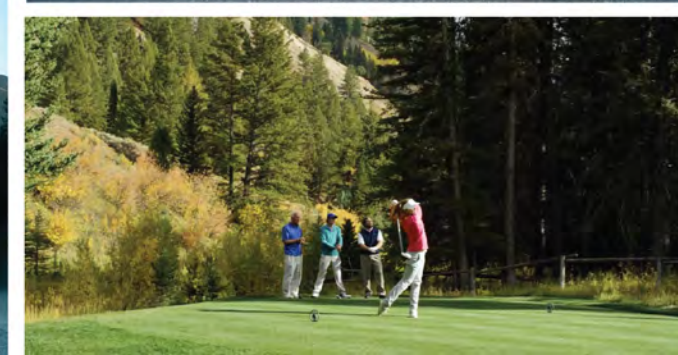

## SUMMER AMENITIES

### BEAVER POND & SPORTS FIELD

Among the Club's multiple waterways is a large pond located between the 11th green and 12th tee, next to the Outdoor Pursuits Barn. Bordered by a small beach that invites relaxation, the calm water is ideal for swimming, kayaking, canoeing and paddleboarding. A variety of non-motorized watercraft are available for rent at the Barn. A nearby athletic field offers space for soccer, football, baseball and other team sports.

### BLUE-RIBBON TROUT FISHING

Born as a trickle of water in Yellowstone National Park, the Snake River has long been famed for its fishing. In fact, the waterway derives its name from a hand gesture the Shoshone Tribe made to indicate swimming salmon—a gesture early explorers misinterpreted to mean snake. Bordering six miles of Snake River frontage, the Club offers an authentic Jackson Hole fly-fishing adventure. Cast for cutthroat trout from the property's banks, shoals, riffles and islands. Or, fly fish the property's stocked ponds and waterways. Flies and fishing gear are available at our Clubhouse Sport Shop. Contact our Outdoor Pursuits Director to arrange guide service, or if you have interest in the Orvis Fly Fishing School we host on property.

### TOM WEISKOPF SHORT GAME PRACTICE FACILITY

Perched on a bench adjacent to the first hole, this double-ended range allows you to practice every kind of shot you might need within 40 yards of the cup. Rehearse your chip, pitch and bunker swings with views of the Snake River as a backdrop. A separate green enables you to perfect your putting game.

### TOM WEISKOPF CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSE

Ranked the #1 Golf Course in Wyoming 2015-2016 by Golf Digest, this 18-hole, 7,500-yard course has undergone major improvements in recent years. The bluegrass fairways and bent-grass greens follow the land's natural topography, stretching from benches to canyon floor. Varying dramatically in shape and length, the holes take you through woodlands, along meandering creeks, over winding bridges and past breathtaking scenery. After one round, you will understand why Weiskopf declared it his finest U.S. design to date.

### CLUBHOUSE

Overlooking the Snake River and surrounded by mature trees, the Clubhouse is designed to serve as your base camp for sporting adventure. The 26,000-square-foot facility comprises a sports shop, restaurant and grill rooms, men's and women's locker rooms, and a furnished outdoor deck for dining or relaxed enjoyment of the views. Adjacent lawns offer



the perfect setting for events. Concierge and Club administration services are headquartered here.

### FITNESS CENTER & GOLF SIMULATOR

Located in the Clubhouse, our Fitness Center features cardio machines, free weights, a climbing wall, and a treatment room. Our recent installation of a Golf Simulator allows members to practice their swing or play 18 holes at clubs around the world during the winter months. The spacious facility is open 24 hours a day.

### FRISBEE GOLF

Here is one game that really does offer fun for the whole family. The object of play is to float a disc into raised baskets with as few throws as possible. The world-class setting adds an extra thrill to the challenge. Our 18-hole course meanders by cottonwoods and even onto an island in the Snake River. Frisbees are available at the Club Sports Shop, or bring your own.



### ARCHERY COURSE

Our course features three-dimensional targets (including life-like elk, antelope, wolverine and even a dinosaur), which make honing your bow skills even more fun.

### CLAY SHOOTING

Set on an elevated river bench, overlooking Wolf Mountain, is our 5-stand shotgun range. We shoot a hybrid of skeet and trap with three automatic clay pigeon throwers. Sharpen your visualization skills and broaden your repertoire of shots with straight away, crossing, and oscillating trap clay targets.

### EQUESTRIAN CENTER

The Club's network of horseback riding trails starts at the Equestrian Center. The trails take you through open fields, along the Snake River, and even along the edges of the golf course. Members can reserve horses, guides and overnight trips at the center. Pasturing is available for privately owned horses.

### CLAY TENNIS COURT

A great game of tennis is a journey, not a destination. For players of all ages, playing on clay is the heart of tennis, providing superior playing characteristics. Racquets and balls are available at the Club Sports Shop.

### SWIMMING POOL

The Club swimming pool features depths for all ages with breathtaking views. Food & Beverage service is available at the Cabana. An adjacent event pad

provides a dramatic location for club events. Swim lessons are available, see the Membership Services/Concierge for scheduling.

### MULTI-USE TRAILS

A network of trails winds through the property, providing a wide variety of environments to explore: islands, river banks, pasturelands, an elevated plateau, and the groomed greens and fairways of the golf course. The Martin Creek trail and other routes connect to National Forest paths, allowing you to explore the surrounding woodlands



## WINTER AMENITIES

### CROSS-COUNTRY SKI TRAILS

In winter, the Club's championship golf course turns into a Nordic skier's playground. 10 miles of groomed trails invite skate and cross-country skiers to glide over the snow-covered golf course and through scenic woodlands. For a deeper backcountry experience, venture into the National Forest via paths accessed by multiple points in property.

### ICE SKATING RINK

Located behind the Clubhouse and next to the sledding hill, our 100' x 60' ice skating rink overlooks a panorama of river and mountains.

### SNOW TERRAIN PARK / TUBING HILL

Need to work on your tricks? Our golf course driving range doubles as a terrain park. Practice your moves on boxes and rails. If you like more speed, try our sledding hill for an exhilarating ride. Tubes and sleds available in the Club Sport Shop.

### HELI-SKIING

Depart for a Jackson Hole heli-skiing adventure right from Snake River Sporting Club, home to one of the few helipads in Teton County. High Mountain Heli-Skiing will whisk you from the property to more than 300,000 acres of skiable terrain in the Snake River and Palisades.

### SKI LOCKERS AT JACKSON HOLE MOUNTAIN RESORT

As a Club member, you enjoy privileged access to our spacious ski lockers at Jackson Hole Mountain Resort. If you are skiing consecutive days, you may leave your gear overnight.

### PADDLE TENNIS COURTS

The game is played on a deck roughly 1/3 the size of a tennis court and is surrounded by a 12' high fence

which allows play off the walls, as in racquetball and squash. The Club's two courts are heated, and lighted, providing year-round opportunity. On inclement days, take a rest in our adjacent warming hut. Racquets and balls are available in the Club Sports Shop.

## YEAR-ROUND AMENITIES

### HOT TUB & FIRE PIT

Adjacent to the swimming pool, the hot tub and fire pit offer the perfect setting for a late afternoon beverage overlooking the Snake River.

### MOUNTAIN BIKING / FAT BIKING

Take advantage of our extensive bike paths/mountain biking trails in the summer or rent one of our fat bikes to take along the cross-country skiing trails in the winter. Our bike path covers the property from north to south and is a great way to explore the entirety of Snake River Sporting Club. If you are interested in off-road experience there are trails in the river bottom and the surrounding National Forest for you to explore.

### SHUTTLE SERVICE TO/FROM JH AIRPORT & JH MOUNTAIN RESORT

Shuttle services are available year-round to and from Jackson Hole Airport and Jackson Hole Mountain Resort. Start your vacation with us doing the driving. Contact the Membership Services/Concierge for scheduling.

## WILDLIFE & VEGETATION

*The outdoor pursuits you enjoy at Snake River Sporting Club are greatly enhanced by the property's beauty and spectacular wildlife. Sinking a long putt on the 18th hole is thrilling, but it feels even more magical on days when you also see a bald eagle or hear an elk bugle. Here are some of the many animals that share the Club property with you. Always observe and photograph wildlife from a safe distance.*



### FINE-SPOTTED CUTTHROAT TROUT

The Club's waterways are home to a particularly beautiful fish; the Snake River fine-spotted cutthroat trout. Named for the hundreds of speckles covering its body, this subspecies is unique among trout in its pursuit of a vertebrate diet, primarily other fish. A network of natural springs flowing into the Club's Martin Creek provide spawning habitat for the trout.



### ELK

In fall, the mountains surrounding the Club echo with the bugle call of bull elk challenging one another to battle. The elk, or wapiti, is the second largest member of the deer family. Often congregating on slopes above the Equestrian Center, wapiti pass through the property on their way to the elk feeding ground at Dog Creek on the other side of Highway 89. Herds fording the



Snake River sometimes use the island just west of the golf course as a staging ground.



### MOOSE

The Club property has been designated crucial winter range for moose, although the animal is only occasionally seen here. Aspen saplings, mixed forests, and various shrubs, such as serviceberry, provide food and cover for moose, the largest member of the deer family.



### BLACK BEAR

These omnivores tend to stick to heavily vegetated mountain terrain, where they find the berries, nuts, roots and fruits that comprise much of their diet. Following their keen noses, black bear also wander into inhabited areas in search of easy meals. Never feed or approach black bears. While they tend to be shy and gentle, black bear are dangerously strong—mere cubs have been observed turning over 325-pound rocks with a single foreleg.



### MULE DEER

Mule deer frequent the Club property year-round, but are particularly numerous in non-winter months. Keep an eye out for them in the hayfield near the equestrian center and in the Martin Creek riparian zones. The regrowth of antlers, which have nerves and blood vessels, is the single instance of organ regeneration in the entire mammalian class.



### BALD EAGLE

Bald eagle pairs have established at least three nests on or near the property, including one in the Martin Creek area. The presence of these nests attest to the quality and diversity of the habitat, for the birds only establish aeries near reliable food sources. Watch for these majestic raptors patrolling the forests and waterways in search of trout, waterfowl and the occasional winter-killed deer.



### HAWKS AND OWLS

The property's forests, shrublands and waterways attract a wide array of raptors. Red-tailed hawks frequently are seen patrolling the

skies, while osprey, Cooper's hawks, goshawks, prairie falcons, and various owl species make occasional appearances.



### TRUMPETER SWAN

The world's largest waterfowl species, the Trumpeter Swan weighs up to 38 pounds and has a wingspan of up to 10 feet. Famously, the swans often mate for life and are fierce defenders of their nests. The female lays three to 12 eggs in spring, and the young are able to swim within two days of hatching. Look for the swans on Trumpeter Lake, a popular feeding and nesting site for the birds.



### GREAT BLUE HERON

These shy wading birds are fairly abundant in Jackson Hole. You'll see blue herons spearing their bills into the water as they forage for small fish, frogs, and other prey along creeks, wetlands and the Snake River. Growing up to four feet in height, the heron flies with its neck folded onto its back, its great wings slowly churning the air.



### COMMON MERGANSER DUCK

Sometimes called sawbills, these goose-sized ducks have bills with serrated edges that help them grip fish and other aquatic prey. Watch for mergansers floating down Snake River or Martin Creek. After bobbing leisurely on the water for some distance, they will turn around and swim back upstream, diving repeatedly for fish along the way.



### TREES, SHRUBS AND FLOWERS

The Club owes much of its beauty to the mosaic of trees, shrubs and grasses that form the property's various wildlife habitats. Fir and aspen blanket the slopes above Wagon Road, while sagebrush and shrublands cloak the valley floor. In riparian areas, cottonwoods and blue spruce thrive. Brightened by wildflowers during summer, the property is even more spectacular when fall turns the aspens and cottonwoods gold.
